
UNION PARLEMENTAIRE EUROPÉENNE

EUROPEAN PARLIAMENTARY UNION,

that aims at achieving a European Federation by parliamentary means.

Its president is Léon Maccas, former member of the Greek Government and deputy of Athens; the vice-presidents are: Ernest Boerlin (Switzerland), Georges Bohy (Belgium), Enzo Giacchero (Italy), Gordon Lang (England), Edmond Michelet (France).

Among the members of our Council figures for the Netherlands Mr. E.G.M. Rodvink, who has constituted a provisional Committee in the Netherland Parliament.

On September 8, 9 and 10, we have called at Gstaad a Parliamentary Conference attended by active members of European Parliaments. Mr. Roolvink will head the Netherland delegation

To make it possible for a number of Dutch members of Parliament and eventually their wifes, to come to Gstaad, we should be most obliged to you if you could assure them the permission to buy Swiss currency for their stay in Switzerland.

I enclose the list of Dutch members of Parliament, who have responded to our questionnaire on European Federation, and the statistics on the answers from other Parliaments of Europe.
