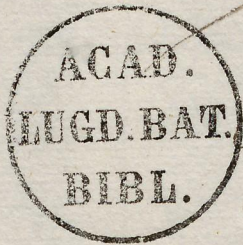

to make my address to you; & as to give you thanks for what I have already received, so to desire this addition to your rest. That you would speak to your friends of strangers in my behalf if his Highness would be pleased to give me an order to one of the men of War (who are yet remaining here at Rotterdam; & intend within 3, or 4 days to follow the Herring Busses) if in case he go into the North parts of England, warr Scarborough, or any other port belonging to your King that he use all possible means to get me downe; these men of Warre being Committed to the Herring ships will go into the North parts; you may please to have a blank in your Commission for the mans name, And as you shall herein do a speciall favor to my particular so I make no question but you will receive an acknowledgement from them whom my business more particularly concerns. & in what service you may possibly have occasion to employ me, be very well assured I will be your person, & your affairs cannot faile to find me

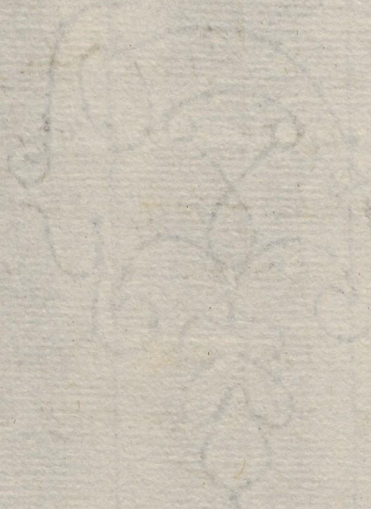
