Rotterdam Adij 17 May 1646



W^ere g^t & write to you concerning gib Highnes, it all ons at ist
I had written to gib Highnes p^rmselv^e. And in sy^epe off quanious
acceptance off my goodwill, and faytfulnes off part, (w^t i^m sm-
rity & profeſſe unto gib Highnes) w^t I am obliged unto for the
benefit w^t (by your loving mediation) I have received by him, about
the retoderyng off my 9 yearcs arrearecs off my pension etc.

Now sit, passing lately scene a booke in print of his negotiation
of D^r Goffe w^t gib Highnes about a mariage betweene hys Prince
of Wales, & gib Highnes daughter, & could not reframe (for hys
considerations abone sayd) to signifit hys boke unto him, and you, —
that w^t his God hath been pleased to make knowne unto me con-
cerning hys matter agitated w^t his sayd Goffe. vizt. That God
hath determined to cut off that race from inheriting the Crowne of
England, and to transfer it unto ffrance (by war) and that before
this present English war hath an end. — A rontlud tyme forw^t
that the more gib Highnes shall strive to crosse hys rampart
of God, the more losse he shall arrue unto hymselfe, and shall
render hymselfe the leſt csteemed of hys Netherlandis. Notice
on. Truly gib Highnes ought to haue been warned (concer-
ning mariage w^t England) by Gods warning from heaven,
by hat w^t his beſte w^t the young Prince first tooke ſhipping
for England. But as he neglected that tyme, he ſhall alſo
neglect hys (by me) now, let him thank God for his war-
nings, blame hymselfe for his ſufferings etc. Now sir, I am not
ignorant that I doe even put my life into your hands, by hys my
weak and faytfulle dealing w^t you in hys busines, for gib
Highnes good, w^t his to know you alſo g̃ygly tender. Sat verbum
sapienti. If you deſire any further account of hys busines at my
hand, you know my readines to ſerve you, and weare I dwelle.
A onely request at your hands, exclud for my boldnes, kind-
nessey, that I ſuffer not epile for my faytfulnes: and doe
most g̃umblly take my leave, & remaine,

yours to be commanded
in all faytfulnes to gib
utmost power
