at quiet. However the resolution is taken not to loose one hour more, and

and in the meane time letters are dispatched both fr<sup>o</sup> th<sup>e</sup>m & into France to  
effect the satisfaction now offered if at last it shall not appeare sufficient. It  
seems some strange if so great a caution as Mr Webster offers to put into his  
hands should not be accepted. If not, this impediment in the busines proceeds  
fr<sup>o</sup> some more hidden principle then the imaginary feare w<sup>h</sup>ich Calandrini hath  
pretended. I stay here to see some present real effects of the diligence  
now promised; if they appeare, I will hope all will succeed well. This account  
I thought necessary to give you, & beleive you will likewise impart it  
where it may be requisite. And herein you will very much oblige

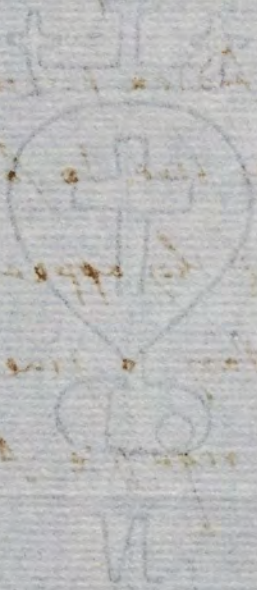
