The proposition made to Mr Webster has found unexpected good
successe in respect of his part; But Calandrini seems yet not thoroughly
at quiet. However the resolution is taken not to loose one hour more, and
accordingly I ^{am} made beleive that the parties are in prosecution of the worke,
and in the meane time letters are dispatched both fr^m th^m & fr^m into France to
effect the satisfaction now offered if at last it shall not appeare sufficient. It
seems some strange if so great a caution as Mr Webster offers to put into his
hands should not be accepted. If not, this impediment in the busines proceeds
fr^m some more hidden principle then the imaginary feare w^{ch} Calandrini hath
pretend^d. I stay here to see some present real effects of the diligence
now promised; if they appeare, I will hope all will succeed well. This account
I thought necessary to give you, & beleive you will likewise impart it
where it may be requisite. And herein you will very much oblige


